Australian Taxation Office under another Deductible Gift Recipient category.

Who can apply: Cultural bodies eligible for listing on the Register are those whose main purpose is the promotion of

a cultural activity such as: literature; visual, community, performing or Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander arts;

music; crafts; design; television; video; radio; film; or movable cultural heritage.

Overview: The Foundation periodically identifies a priority area of focus. The Foundation currently has two priority areas of focus, being:

1. Community based organisations that provide services addressing the psychological and social impact

experienced by the long term unemployed (For the avoidance of doubt, this Priority Area of Focus does not cover job placement and/or re-training programs)

2. Projects aimed at the preservation of specific endangered flora and/or fauna within Australia

Rather than inviting applications from a broad section of the public, the Foundation will each year identify potential

candidates for grants in the Foundation's nominated priority area. Each year the independent Board of Directors of

the Foundation expects to identify a select number of projects for which an agreed contribution will be made to the approved organisation(s).

Although organisations should no longer apply to the Foundation for a grant, if an organisation has a project which

relates to the Foundation's current priority area, it may register a request to be considered by the Foundation by

lodging a Project Notification in the form attached. Such notification may be lodged electronically or by hard copy to the Foundation.

If lodging a Project Notification form, please note that:

- the project must fall within the Foundation's nominated priority area;
- the organisation must be an eligible recipient under the Income Tax Assessment Act;
- the project must be consistent with the broader aims and objectives of the Foundation (published on this

website); and

- all areas of the attached form must be completed.

The Foundation will acknowledge receipt of the Project Notification form, but this should not be seen as in any way

indicating that the request for consideration will progress further.

Any Project Notification received by the Foundation will be considered at the Foundation's Board meetings held in

October 2011 and April 2012. As such Project Notifications must be submitted for notification by 30 September 2011

and 31 March 2012 respectively. The Foundation's Board meets approximately four times per year, and accordingly a

period of some months may elapse between lodgment of a Project Notification and it being selected for detailed

consideration

Once the Foundation selects a project for further consideration, it may seek a detailed submission from the applicant

and/or seek to confer with the applicant.

- Not-for-profit Organisations can apply for projects and activities that offer clear public benefit for communities

living in small rural and remote locations in Australia, contributing to their development in social and

- Applications from communities with a population of 10,000 or less will receive priority.

- Grants will be made in amounts up to \$5,000.

- To be eligible, projects must be for a charitable purpose (benefit the whole community). As this is a

collaborative program there are some grants which are restricted either to Deductible Gift Recipients (DGRs)

or Tax Concession Charity (TCC) organisations or must be granted in Victoria; the Benalla region (Victoria) or

the Far North Queensland region. The majority of funds are unrestricted.

- Organisations should also have an ABN.

- Organisations demonstrating Community Partnerships will be preferred to multiple applications from one community.

- Cost of fundraising for an event or organisation
- Travel and accommodation (except where they directly relate to the provision of services to regional, rural and remote communities)
- Medical Research.

Who can apply: The TFFF is a Private Ancillary Fund (PAF) (formerly known as a Prescribed Private Fund or PPF) and as such is restricted to distributing to entities which are endorsed as Deductible Gift Recipients (DGRs) and which are also charitable. PAFs are prohibited from giving to other PAFs, ancillary funds, individuals and political parties.

Applying organisations must also hold tax concession endorsements from the Australian Tax Office (ATO).
