a cultural activity such as: literature; visual, community, performing or Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander arts;

music; crafts; design; television; video; radio; film; or movable cultural heritage.

also charitable. PAFs are prohibited from giving to other PAFs, ancillary funds, individuals and political parties.

Applying organisations must also hold tax concession endorsements from the Australian Tax Office (ATO).
