- Requests for capital works (although projects for capital fit-out requirements can be considered)
- Fundraising, public appeals or loans
- Contributions to the corpuses of other foundation trusts or not-for-profit organisations.

The Foundation can only accept applications from individuals where they have a confirmed auspice or funding partner.

The auspice must have the appropriate ATO endorsements as described previously (TCC and DGR) and your project

will need to be equivalent or similar to their field of activity or business.

Who can apply:

Organisations seeking consideration of funding must be endorsed as both:

1. a Tax Concession Charity or TCC (formerly ITEC - Income Tax Exempt Charity); and
2. a Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR) to be eligible for consideration.

Purpose: To award non-profits with free AdWords advertising on Google.com.au to raise awareness and increase traffic.

Overview: Google Grants is a unique and free advertising programme designed for non-profit institutions or funds that have either been endorsed as such in Australia by the Commissioner of Taxation, or prescribed as charitable institutions in the Income Tax Assessment Regulations of 1997. The programme has awarded AdWords advertising to hundreds of qualified non-profit groups whose missions range from animal welfare to literacy, from supporting homeless children to promoting HIV education. Each organisation choosing to participate in Google Grants receives at least three months of free advertising.

Examples: Grant recipients use their award of free AdWords advertising on Google.com.au to raise awareness and increase traffic. Three of our award recipients have achieved these results:

- Room to Read, which educates children in Vietnam, Nepal, India and Cambodia, attracted a sponsor who clicked on its AdWords ad. He has donated funds to support the education of 25 girls for the next 10 years.
- The US Fund for UNICEF's e-commerce site, Shop UNICEF, has experienced a 43 percent increase in sales over the previous year.
- CoachArt, supporting children with life-threatening illnesses through art and athletics programs, has seen a 60 to 70 percent increase in volunteers.

Limitations: You will need to have a website to advertise with Google Grants.

Who can apply: Organisation must be institutions or funds that have either been endorsed as such in Australia by the Commissioner of Taxation, or prescribed as charitable institutions in the Income Tax Assessment Regulations of

1997, to be considered for this programme.

Purpose: These grants are typically designed to seed the early stages of new research efforts, often with the expectation that the evidence gathered through these efforts will lead to a future project grant application.

Overview: A Project Grant, Post Doctoral Fellowship, Postgraduate Scholarship, Summer Vacation Scholarship and

Incubator Grant is an award made in support of either a pure research or social science/applied project within an

Australian institution proposed by an appropriately qualified investigator. The project is to be consistent with the aim

of MSRA and the work is to be approved by the host institution (including relevant ethics committees). The institution

is responsible for administration of the grant. Researchers who are based overseas for the duration of the grant are

not eligible to apply. No person funded by MSRA can be regarded as an employee of MSRA.

The award of project grants is MSRA's main avenue for the support of research relevant to multiple sclerosis in

universities, hospitals or other recognised research institutions. Since these awards will normally be made for a period

of two years only, the purpose is primarily to assist investigations in which considerable progress can be expected

over this or a shorter period. MSRA does not intend to provide long term salaries for support staff.

Applications are made in two stages, Preliminary Enquiry and Detailed Application. A Preliminary Enquiry will be notified of the outcome within two weeks of receipt and if considered to have merit may be invited to submit a

Detailed Application. A detailed application, provided all required information has been received, will be reviewed and submitted to the Board for approval. Applicants may be required to supply further documentation before an assessment is made.

Applicants will be notified in writing of the outcome of their detailed submission.

Limitations: Legal and policy considerations prevent the Foundation from supporting or making grants in the following categories:

- Individuals, state and federal government bodies
- Organisations outside Australia
- Projects which can receive funding internally, by a government agency or corporate sponsorship

- Operating costs including salaries, administration costs, budget deficits, unless such costs are part of an otherwise eligible project
- Capital and building expenditure, including equipment, vehicles, furniture, books, conferences, and religious activities, unless such costs are part of an otherwise eligible project
- Retrospective funding
- Fundraising events and campaigns
- Travel
- Medical programs or research
