**Purpose:** To sponsor vital projects or activities in the Arts and Health which would not otherwise happen.

**Overview:** A project or activity only in the arts or health areas, which

- Creates discovery in the arts and or health fields to break new ground and set up opportunities for the future.

- Increases the capacity of communities to foster their arts and health activities and the capacity of talented individuals with the commitment and potential to improve our world.

- Enables establishment of arts or health activities with real potential to take off and be ongoing

**Limitations:** Applications can not be accepted from any of the following organisations or for any of the following categories:

- For-Profit bodies and commercial/business entities

- Political Parties

- Private Schools

- Sports Clubs

- Organisations outside Australia

- Requests for retrospective funding

- Requests for capital works (although projects for capital fit-out requirements can be considered)

Fundraising, public appeals or loans

Contributions to the corpuses of other foundation trusts or not-for-profit organisations.

The Foundation can only accept applications from individuals where they have a confirmed auspice or funding partner. The auspice must have the appropriate ATO endorsements as described previously (TCC and DGR) and your project will need to be equivalent or similar to their field of activity or business.

**Who can apply:**

Organisations seeking consideration of funding must be endorsed as both:

1.  
a Tax Concession Charity or TCC (formerly ITEC - Income Tax Exempt Charity); and
2.  
a Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR) to be eligible for consideration.

**Purpose:** To foster activities and programs concerned with improving parent/child relationships in Australia.

**Overview:** The Inger Rice Foundation was established in 1973 through the initiative of Inger Rice - wife of the then Ambassador of the United States of America.

The foundation fosters activities and programs concerned with improving parent/child relationships in Australia. In particular the Foundation directs its grants towards parental relationships with younger children from birth to pre-birth up to primary school age (0-5 years). The Trustees will also take into account grants for other

purposes but preference will be given to the above mentioned category.

The foundation offers financial support for training, research and provision of material and equipment to persons and groups through approved organisations. Assistance provided includes help with costs such as fares and living expenses of attending conferences and seminars, fees for specific programs and grants for research projects, training courses and development programs. Contributions may also be made toward the costs of brochures, monographs, films and project materials.

The Foundation does not have a standard application form. It prefers an individual submission. Letters briefly describing the organisation, outlining aims, objectives and details of a proposed project and estimated costs.

Applications are ongoing but the assessment process occurs every 6 to 8 weeks.

**Purpose:** To award non-profits with free AdWords advertising on Google.com.au to raise awareness and increase traffic.

**Overview:** Google Grants is a unique and free advertising programme designed for non-profit institutions or funds that have either been endorsed as such in Australia by the Commissioner of Taxation, or prescribed as charitable institutions in the Income Tax Assessment Regulations of 1997. The programme has awarded AdWords advertising to hundreds of qualified non-profit groups whose missions

range from animal welfare to literacy, from supporting homeless children to promoting HIV education.

Each organisation choosing to participate in Google Grants receives at least three months of free advertising.

**Examples:** Grant recipients use their award of free AdWords advertising on Google.com.au to raise awareness and increase traffic. Three of our award recipients have achieved these results:

- Room to Read, which educates children in Vietnam, Nepal, India and Cambodia, attracted a sponsor who clicked on its AdWords ad. He has donated funds to support the education of 25 girls for the next 10 years.

- The US Fund for UNICEF's e-commerce site, Shop UNICEF, has experienced a 43 percent increase in sales over the previous year.

- CoachArt, supporting children with life-threatening illnesses through art and athletics programs, has seen a 60 to 70 percent increase in volunteers.

**Limitations:** You will need to have a website to advertise with Google Grants.

**Who can apply:**

Organisation must be institutions or funds that have either been endorsed as such in Australia by the Commissioner of Taxation, or prescribed as charitable institutions in the Income Tax Assessment Regulations of 1997, to be considered for this programme.

**Purpose:** To support events or projects that'll benefit the Australian Deaf community and Australians with a speech, communication or hearing impairment.

**Overview:** If your sponsorship request is successful, we ask you to acknowledge ACE in any publications or literature you produce for the event. This can include brochures, posters, videos and other published materials.

Once you receive sponsorship, you must also meet the following obligations:

1. Use the sponsorship strictly in line with your approved sponsorship submission.
2. Only distribute sponsorship in line with your approved sponsorship submission.
3. Use the sponsorship within the specified timeframe.
4. Fulfil the sponsorship financial reporting requirements.
5. Maintain the organisation's ABN registration and comply with the obligations and responsibilities under GST legislation.

**Who can apply:** You can apply for sponsorship if you're:

- Based in Australia.
- Incorporated in an Australian state or territory (eg. an incorporated body) - you need to supply us a copy of the certificate of incorporation.
- Any individual or unincorporated organisation (as long as you're sponsored by an incorporated organisation)
- Interested in or responsible for, advocacy or services for people who are Deaf, or have a hearing impairment or speech impairment.

The event must be carried out in Australia.

Also, your event will be highly regarded if it's got a national focus.

Note: You must choose a staff member or authorised representative to be your contact person. They must understand the sponsorship request and its timelines.

**Purpose:** To support a clinician undertaking research in a clinical setting.

**Overview:** The grant is to provide clinical backfill to enable the applicant to undertake research over a 12 month period. Completion of the project within 12 months must be feasible.

Preference will be given to

- Innovative projects with demonstrable clinical relevance
- Pilot studies to enable a research project to be developed such that it could be supported by a recognised grant-giving agency in subsequent years
- Studies investigating priority areas for research as identified in the National Stroke Foundation's Clinical Guidelines

**Who can apply:** The grant is available to any clinician working in the field of stroke who will undertake a clinical research project. Applicants will be individuals who are not currently receiving financial support for a post graduate degree. The proposed research project will be one that is not currently supported by other grants. The research will be undertaken in collaboration with an academic with a proven track record. The academic partner will have an active role in planning, implementing, and disseminating the results of the research project.

The research must be carried out in Australia.

**Purpose:** To fund research in the area of stroke rehabilitation or quality of life post stroke.

**Overview:** The National Stroke Foundation is funding grants for research in the following areas:

- research into rehabilitation, or services that improve quality of life (this will generally not include acute interventions)

- basic science (basic biomedical research with relevance to stroke. (E.g. experimental stroke modelling)

Preference will be given to

- Innovative projects

- Pilot studies to enable a research project to be developed such that it could be supported by a recognised grant-giving agency in subsequent years

- Studies investigating priority areas for research as identified in the National Stroke Foundation's Clinical Guidelines for Stroke Rehabilitation and Recovery

Each grant is to be used for equipment, support personnel such as research assistants or casual help, or other assistance necessary for a specific project.

**Who can apply:** Preference will be given to new investigators, either clinicians or neuroscientists, to help them establish an ongoing research program.

The research must be carried out in Australia.

**Purpose:** To support women's groups that advance the human rights of women and girls.

**Overview:** The Global Fund for Women supports women's groups that advance the human rights of women and girls. GFW grants help strengthen and link women's funds based outside the United States by providing flexible and timely grants ranging from \$5,000 to \$50,000 per year for operating and re-granting expenses. First-time grant awards generally range from \$5,000 to \$25,000 per year. We value local expertise and believe that women themselves know best how to determine their needs and propose solutions for lasting change.

The Global Fund receives over 3,500 proposals for general support, including the women's funds, each year and awards about 600 grants annually. Unfortunately we do not have the resources to provide funding to all the Women's Funds that meet our criteria. We do,

however, give priority to Women's Funds that might particularly benefit from our support. These include groups that:

- Are actively fundraising from local sources.
- Are located in a region or country that has extremely limited access to funding resources.
- Are making grants to groups working on issues that are difficult or controversial for women to raise in their communities, yet are critical to the realization of women's human rights.
- Are making grants to women's groups organized and led by women from particularly marginalized populations, including but not limited to: refugees, rural women, economically disadvantaged women, women with disabilities, lesbian, bisexual and transgender (LGBTQI) populations, sex workers, women affected by military occupation, women in conflict and post-conflict regions, girls and young women, and women from ethnic, religious, and cultural minorities.
- Actively include the perspectives of those served by or benefiting from the fund's activities.

We have three types of grants:

1.

General Support Grants - These are flexible, small grants to cover general operating and project expenses.

o

Your group must meet ALL the basic criteria (listed under "application requirements" of the grant application form) to be eligible for a grant.

o

A group may only have one proposal of any type under consideration at a given time.

o

Amount granted may be less than the amount requested if and when an award is made

2.

Travel Grants - These are small grants that allow members of an organization to attend conferences and events.

o

Your group must meet all the basic criteria (listed under "application requirements" of the grant application form) to be eligible for a grant.

o

A group may only have one proposal of any type under consideration at a given time.

o

Amount granted may be less than the amount requested if and when an award is made.

- Applications for travel and event grants must be received at least 8 weeks before the beginning of the event. Funds for these kinds of grants are limited.

- Because travel grant funding is limited, priority will be given to former Global Fund for Women grantees that do not have access to other funding sources.

3.

Organizing Meeting/Event Grants - These are small grants to support organizations planning a time-sensitive conference or event.

- 

Organizing Meeting/Event requests must be received no later than 8 weeks before the beginning of the event.

- Because our funding for such travel grants is so limited, priority will be given to former Global Fund for Women grantees that do not have access to other funding sources.

**Priorities:** The Global Fund seeks to strengthen and sustain local philanthropy of Women's Funds by investing in the following priority areas:

- 

Providing general operating support to build grantmaking, fundraising, and organizational capacity of women's funds.

- 

Promoting mutual learning exchanges among women's funds.

**Limitations:** In addition, please note that the Global Fund does NOT fund the following:

- 

Individuals

- 

Government entities

- 

Groups based and working primarily or only in the US

- 

Women's Funds in the Global North proposing projects with local partners

- 

Groups whose sole purpose is to generate income or to provide charity to individuals

- 

Groups headed and managed by men, without women in the majority of leadership positions

- 

Funds that support political parties or election campaigns

- 

Women's branches, departments, or projects of mixed gender organizations.

**Who can apply:** Please note that your Women's Fund MUST meet all the following criteria to be eligible for a grant:

- It is based in a country outside the United States. We do not fund US based organizations.

- Its primary focus is to award grants to women's human rights groups. o Its past or proposed activities include grantmaking and/or capacity-building for women's rights groups.

- It is governed, directed, and led by women. Women must fill most or all of the leadership roles.

**Purpose:** To provide funding for organisations that share the Foundation's common purpose and vision to assist disadvantaged young people to benefit from and contribute to the common good and provide a vehicle which nurtures self worth.

**Overview:** Funding priorities:

- Projects which benefit disadvantaged young people by addressing the causes of poverty and injustice.

- Projects which are not eligible for funding from public or government sources.

- Projects that address violence, social justice, economic and social disadvantage.

- Projects which address the needs of disadvantaged children and young people directly.

- Projects involving education, arts and culture, employment and training, housing and accommodation.

- Priority will be given to peak bodies, self-help groups, neighbourhood projects and direct service provision.

Applications are made in two stages, Preliminary Enquiry and Detailed Application. A Preliminary Enquiry will be notified of the outcome within two weeks of receipt and if considered to have merit may be invited to submit a Detailed Application. A detailed application, provided all required information has been received, will be reviewed and submitted to the Board for approval. Applicants may be required to supply further documentation before an assessment is made.

Applicants will be notified in writing of the outcome of their detailed submission.

**Limitations:** Legal and policy considerations prevent the Foundation from supporting or making grants in the following categories:

- Individuals, state and federal government bodies

- Organisations outside Australia

- Projects which can receive funding internally, by a government agency or corporate sponsorship

- Operating costs including salaries, administration costs, budget deficits, unless such costs are part of an otherwise eligible project

- Capital and building expenditure, including equipment, vehicles, furniture, books, conferences, and religious activities, unless such costs are part of an otherwise eligible project

- Retrospective funding

- Fundraising events and campaigns

- Travel
- Medical programs or research

**Who can apply:** If your organization does not have Income Tax Exempt Charity (ITEC) status and are a Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR) we will not be able to consider your application.
