Funding: Please note Festivals Australia operates as a two-tier program with different application forms for small projects and large projects. Small projects are those seeking funding support of up to \$12 000. Large projects are those seeking funding above \$12 000.

Closes: 15 July 2010

Purpose: To provide funds for Australian regional and community festivals to assist them to present quality cultural projects.

Overview: Funds are available to present exciting new projects which will add to the cultural program of a regular, ongoing festival or a significant one-off community celebration.

Funds are not available for projects such as competitions, capital works (e.g. the construction of buildings, or the purchase of equipment) or the ongoing costs of running the festival.

Assistance is provided in the form of direct funding, subject to a formal Funding Agreement.

You cannot receive funding from Festivals Australia, the Regional Arts Fund or the Indigenous Cultural Support Program for the same project or the same event at a festival.

Who can apply: Applications must be made by organisations that manage regular festivals. Eligible organisations include local governments and councils, cultural organisations and regional arts councils that manage festivals.

The Peter Brock Foundation aims to work towards the following goals when allocating funding:

- Small, discreet projects that meet the needs of a community rather than supplementary funding for large projects. A small, discreet project will be considered to have a total budget of up to \$50,000.

Limitations: The Myer Foundation and Sidney Myer Fund do not provide grants directly to individuals or unincorporated bodies.

Who can apply: The Myer Foundation and the Sidney Myer Fund will accept applications for grants for charitable purposes from Australian incorporated organisations that have been endorsed by the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) as Tax Concession Charities (TCC). If your organisation is not endorsed as a TCC, but you are an Australian incorporated organisation, you may still be eligible to apply as long as we can be satisfied that the nature of your project is charitable.

Summary Details

Purpose: To support organisations who focus their activities on the disadvantaged, disabled or those suffering from long-term and life threatening illnesses.

Overview: The Honda Foundation will only provide financial assistance to bodies who are approved by the Commissioner of Taxation to accept tax deductible donations of \$2.00 or more.

In particular, The Honda Foundation provides financial assistance to:

- Deserving charities; Approved bodies who focus their activities on the disadvantaged, disabled or those suffering from long-term, life threatening illnesses
- Approved humanitarian bodies
- Approved bodies who provide ad-hoc relief to victims of natural disasters
- Approved bodies who promote inventions and the development of new technology
- Approved bodies who promote the development and preservation of Australian culture.

The Honda Foundation Trustees consider applications for funding at Trustees meetings scheduled in February, June and October of each year. Application close one month prior.

Examples: Some of the pieces of equipment we have financed are as follows:

- Wheelchairs for use in hospitals and nursing homes
- Hospital beds, portable hoist and other medical equipment, including operating theatre machinery
- Ambulance/SES resuscitation machines, defibrillators and rescue equipment
- Purchase of equipment for use in scientific research units
- Sensory garden installation for handicapped people
- Purchase of resource kits for disabled children
- Furnish accommodation units for cancer patients
- Purchase computer equipment for running special needs programs

Limitations: Incorporated charitable organisations only.
