

During the current exceptional circumstances caused by COVID-19, the AMTA wants to continue to support the membership in accruing CPD points. To allay any confusion down the track, the CPD committee would like to clarify the evidence required to claim CPD points for both AMTA and non-AMTA hosted activities:

AMTA hosted webinars:

- If you attend the live meeting, write your name in the chat box, or email your name, date and webinar attended to info@austmta.org.au if phoning in, and you will receive a certificate from the AMTA secretariat.
- If you watch the recording, you will complete a 3 question quiz related to the content. 100% accuracy on the quiz must be achieved for you to receive your certificate from the secretariat, otherwise you will be asked to re-watch the video before resubmitting the quiz.
- Points will be allocated as per 2.3 in the handbook (1 hour = 1 point)

Non-AMTA hosted webinars:

- Please refer to the handbook for the evidence required. The majority of these webinars will likely fall under Category 2.3
- For some of the webinars, it may not be possible to receive a certificate or email the organiser. In this instance, we ask that you write a 500 word document to demonstrate an understanding of the content.
- If you or someone you know would like to host a webinar, you are able to claim points for presenting under Category 2.9 of the handbook. Please remember to inform the CPD committee so we can ensure that the correct points are claimed for both the participants and the presenter come submission time. You can either fill in a 'CPD Events - Pre-Allocation of CPD Points Online Form' found in the Resources section of the CPD Dashboard, or contact the Chair of CPD directly at cpd@austmta.org.au

Please remember that CPD is about upskilling for your professional practice. Therefore, as well as music therapy-specific webinars, you may also claim points for other topics related to your work, e.g. technology, telehealth, policy updates, etc. If you are unsure whether a webinar or course is claimable, please contact cpd@austmta.org.au
