

WHAT IS AN INACTIVE RMT AND WHY IS IT VALUABLE?

Inactive RMT is a new category of membership specifically designed for an RMT who is taking a career break, but who intends to return to the profession.

To qualify as an Inactive RMT you must not be working as a music therapist in Australia, in any capacity in the given membership year, which is 1 July to 30 June. Inactive RMT is a category that is widely used by a parent who is taking some time away from the profession to bring up children, someone travelling for extensive time or those who trained in Australia but now work overseas as music therapists and are accredited by that country's certification but who wish to remain in contact with Australian registration.

Becoming an Inactive RMT reduces the annual fee, but please note it does not relieve you of your CPD obligations. You must continue to maintain your CPD as if you were a full RMT.
